Abstract

Online marketplace (electronic commerce or EC) is the buying and selling of goods and services, or the transmitting of funds or data, over an electronic network, primarily the internet. These business transactions occur either as business-to-business, business-to-consumer. The terms e-commerce and e-business are often used interchangeably. The term e-tail is also sometimes used in reference to transactional processes for online shopping.

This project provides the user with a category of different electronic products available for purchase in the store. In order to make the purchase happen, a shopping cart is available to the user. The features that are provided by the website are Customer and Admin registration which means they can create account and log in, shopping cart, product searching, payment option, delivery options and interacting facilities through email.

This system is based on a 3-tier approach, with a backend database, a middle tier of Apache web server and Object oriented PHP, and a web browser as the front end client.

The tools used for this project include PHP, HTML5, CSS and JavaScript as programming language and MySQL for backend database. The ER diagrams of the system and use case model were developed.

Chapter 1

Introduction

To develop an Online Marketplace system which will provide buying and selling of product through the use of internet is the main target of this project. Moreover, the system has been developed in such a way which makes it reliable, secure and user friendly. Online Marketplace is a system which keeps a list of Stocks of products and can do operations on them. The another major operation is Purchase in which all the billing details, transactions and stock purchasing details are involved in it.

Online marketplace is the service by which consumers can directly buy goods and different categories of products from a real-time seller organization over the internet. So it is the process of buying for the customer and selling for the merchant or organization who sell on the internet. Since the advancement of technology, the customers are becoming more and more eager to buy necessary things sitting at home and just using the internet and computer rather than actually go to the shop physically. That's why because of the emergence of the World Wide Web, merchants have sought to sell their products to people who surf the internet. Thus people can buy just about anything from companies that provide their products online with the help of internet and computer.

1.1 Motivation:

In the existing system, a client has to visit every store to buy a product physically. He faces difficulties to judge a certain product's quality and price. So, there is a higher possibility for a customer to loose in the bargain in terms of price or quality of a certain product. Moreover, a customer also looses extra time and physical strength while doing shopping in the market or mall. So the key points are: 1. Lack of privacy, 2. Lack of authentication, 3. Product may not be reliable and secure, 4. Lack of report printing system.

1.2 Purpose of the Project

The system is willing to replace the existing system for the buying and selling process via online which is not efficient, lengthy process and time consuming. This system is more user friendly than existing system that is why the consumers can easily access the system and can look for the desired items they are willing to buy. The administrators can easily access their information. The main purpose of the system will be efficient buying, selling and maintaining a secure transaction process between the merchants and the customers. So the key points are:

 - **Manage Online Marketplace:** Using module admin can manage our marketplace with inserting a category of product in the store. Also an admin can edit or delete the category item.
- **For User:**
- **Insert Detail:** A user can register and can insert their personal information for further activity confirmation in the application.
 - **View Product Information:** This system shows that the Users can see some basic information of the products without going for full details.

Requirement Analysis

Requirements analysis, also called requirements engineering, is the process of determining user expectations for a new or modified product. These features, called requirements, must be quantifiable, relevant and detailed. In software engineering, such requirements are often called functional specifications.

It is the process that covers what the software is expected to do and how it behaves. So it first collects what the expectations of the users are and then it reflects them in the system.

3.1 Requirement Analysis

This Online Marketplace system required the following requirements. This has mainly two actors. Those are Admin and User. In an E-Commerce service Business holder is known as Admin and Customer is known as the User.

3.2 System Analysis

System Analysis is the act, process, or profession of studying an activity such as a procedure, a business, or a physiological function typically by mathematical means in order to define its goals or purposes and to discover operations and procedures for accomplishing them most efficiently.

During this process, the present system is observed and data are collected from the available files. So, system observation is the main tool used for system analysis.

3.3 Data Requirement

During requirement analysis the following data have been identified for an e-commerce system:

- At first each person need to register himself/herself as a User or an Admin for accessing the necessary information. They also have a user id and password. They can login to the system from the web using their id and password.

- Admin need to login to the system to operate the system. Admin has an individual or unique login user id and password. Through this id and password admin can login to the system.
- A User can search and browse for the product he is willing to buy.
- Admin can update all the information of the registered items. Any registered items can be deleted by the Admin. And also can view all the details of the Users.
- Admin can update the category list of the products. An admin can edit or delete a category from the category list. Admin can also insert a new category menu in the category list. Admin can also insert product with price and quantity.
- Users can choose and buy their expected products from the system and can confirm the order by choosing the payment method.
- There is a virtual shopping cart available in the system for choosing multiple products and storing in it until the shopping is complete.
- After completing the shopping, the users can choose the payment method which is via credit card or via cash on delivery.

3.4 Process Requirement

The following process requirements are identified for job system:

- A valid login is required for all process to be performed. A valid login is required for every registered users and admin. All of them have a valid user id and password. System will authenticate their valid login.
- After valid login Admin and User can check his/her information and can see personal information.
- Admin can login to the system. Admin can view, delete and update all members' information. Admin can also enter new category in the list and insert new products.

3.5 Physical Design

The physical design relates to the actual input and output processes of the system. This is laid down in terms of how data is input into a system, how it is verified or authenticated, how it is processed, and how it is displayed as In Physical design; the following requirements about the system are decided.

- Input requirements
- Output requirements
- Storage requirements
- Processing Requirements

Put another way, the physical portion of systems design can generally be broken down into three subtasks-

- User Interface Design
- Data Design
- Process Design

3.7 Software Implementation

For designing this project HTML, CSS, JAVASCRIPT are used which is open source. Apache web server is used as web server. PHP is used for database coding. MySQL is used as database server.

3.7.1 HTML5

HTML5 is short form of **Hyper Text Markup Language** and it is a language that are used to create electronic documents, especially pages on the World Wide Web that contain connections called hyperlinks to other pages. Every web page you see on the Internet, including this one contains HTML code that helps format and show text and images in an easy to read format. Without HTML a browser would not know how to format a page and would only display plain text with no formatting that contained no links.

3.7.2 PHP

PHP is probably the most popular scripting language on the web. It is used to enhance web pages. If you've come across a web page that ends in PHP, then the author has written some programming code to liven up the plain, old HTML. PHP is known as a server-sided language. That's because the PHP doesn't get executed on your computer. But on the computer you requested the page from. The results are then handed over to you, and displayed in your browser.

Apache is developed and maintained by an open community of developers under the auspices of the Apache Software Foundation. Most commonly used on a Unix-like system, the software is available for a wide variety of operation systems, including Unix, FreeBSD, Linux, Solaris, Novell NetWare, OSX, Microsoft Windows, OS/2, TPF, OpenVMS and eComStation. Released under the Apache License, Apache is open-source software.

Sublime Text is the web development tool that lets you efficiently design, develop and maintain standards-based websites and applications. Sublime text provides a powerful combination of visual layout tools, application development features, and code editing support.

Chapter 4

Design of the System

System design is the process of defining the architecture, modules, interfaces, and data for a system to satisfy specified requirements. Systems design could be seen as the application of systems theory to product development. There is some overlap with the disciplines of systems analysis, systems architecture and systems engineering.

It implies a systematic approach to the design of a system. It may take a bottom-up or top-down approach, but either way the process is systematic wherein it takes into account all related variables of the system that needs to be created—from the architecture, to the required hardware and software, right down to the data and how it travels and transforms throughout its travel through the system. Systems design then overlaps with systems analysis, systems engineering and systems architecture.

The systems design approach first appeared right before World War II, when engineers were trying to solve complex control and communications problems. They needed to be able to standardize their work into a formal discipline with proper methods, especially for new fields like information theory, operations research and computer science in general.

4.1 Use Case Model

A use case diagram is a graphic depiction of the interactions among the elements of a system.

It is a methodology used in system analysis to identify, clarify, and organize system requirements. In this context, the term "system" refers to something being developed or operated, such as a mail-order product sales and service Web site. Use case diagrams are employed in UML (Unified Modeling Language), a standard notation for the modeling of real-world objects and systems.

System objectives can include planning overall requirements, validating a hardware design, testing and debugging a software product under development, creating an online help reference, or performing a consumer-service-oriented task. For example, use cases in a product sale environment would include item ordering, catalog updating, payment processing, and customer relations. A use case diagram contains four components.

- The boundary, which defines the system of interest in relation to the world around it.
- The actors, usually individuals involved with the system defined according to their roles.
- The use cases, which the specific roles are played by the actors within and around the system.
- The relationships between and among the actors and the use cases.

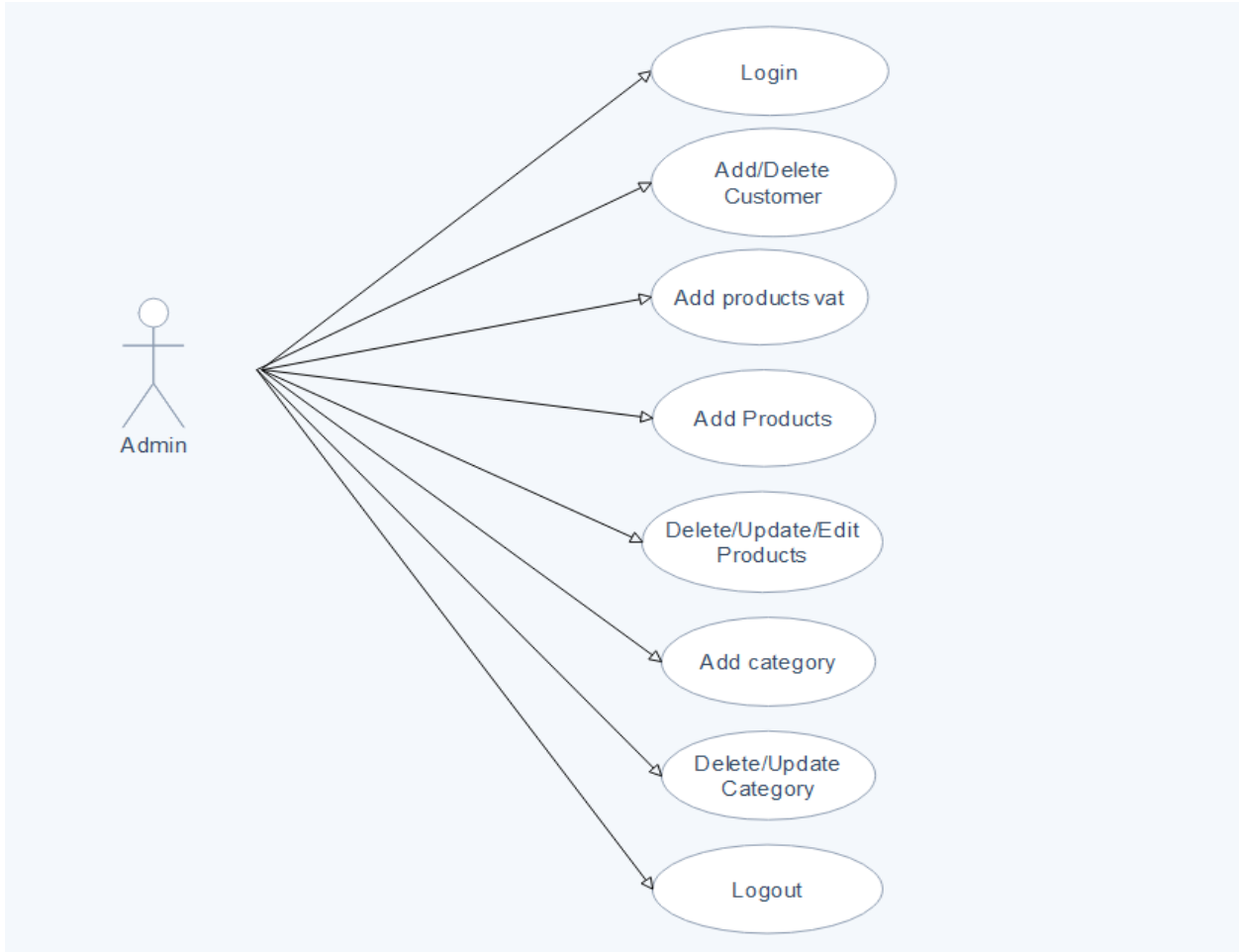


Figure 4: Use Case Model for Admin

4.2 Use Case Model for Admin: A **use case diagram** is a graphic depiction of the interactions among the elements of a system Figure 4 shows the Use case diagram of admin where the admin can login, add/delete customer, add products, delete/update product, add/update category, logout.

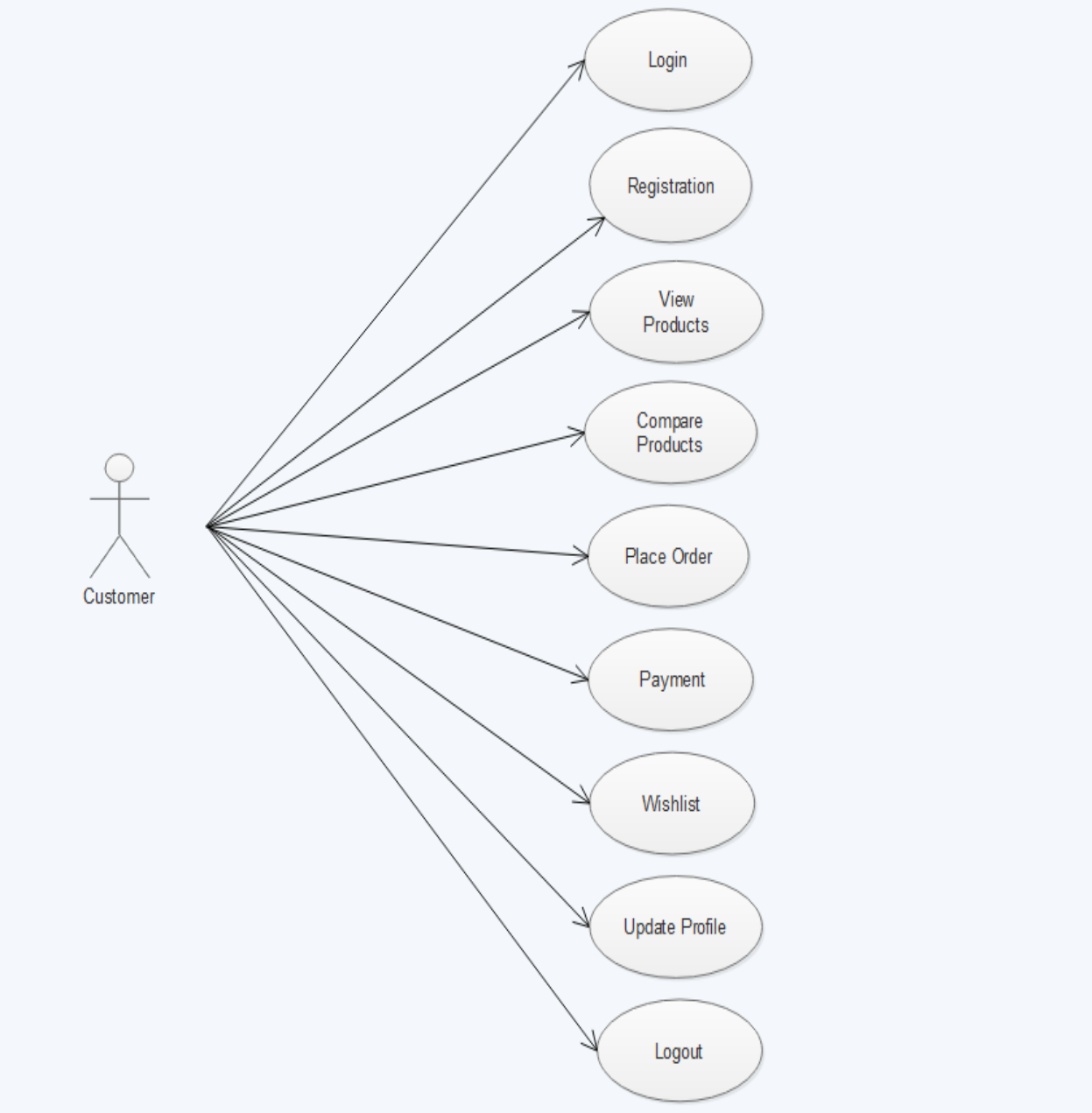


Figure 5: Use Case Model for Admin

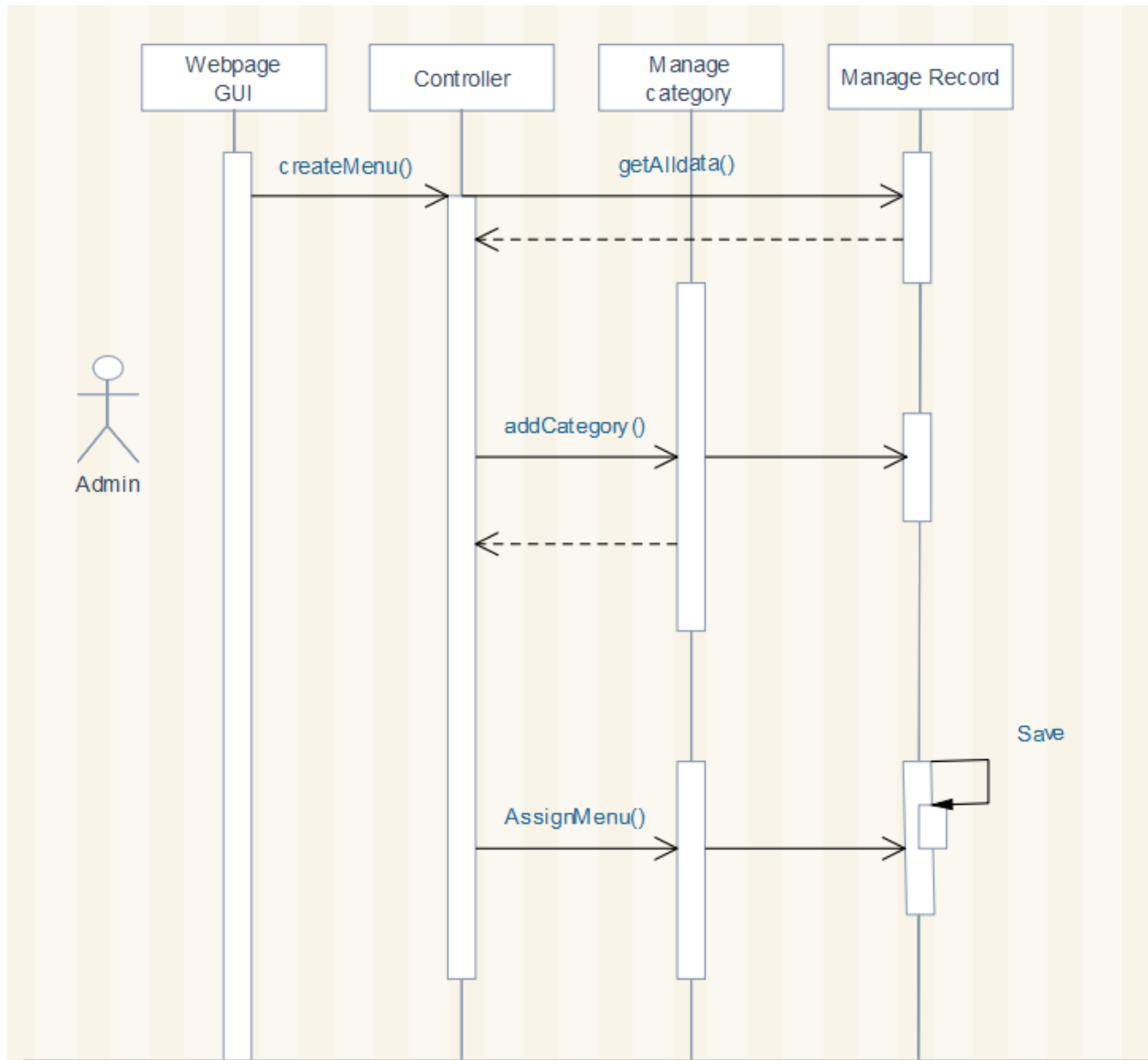


Figure 6: Sequence Diagram for Admin

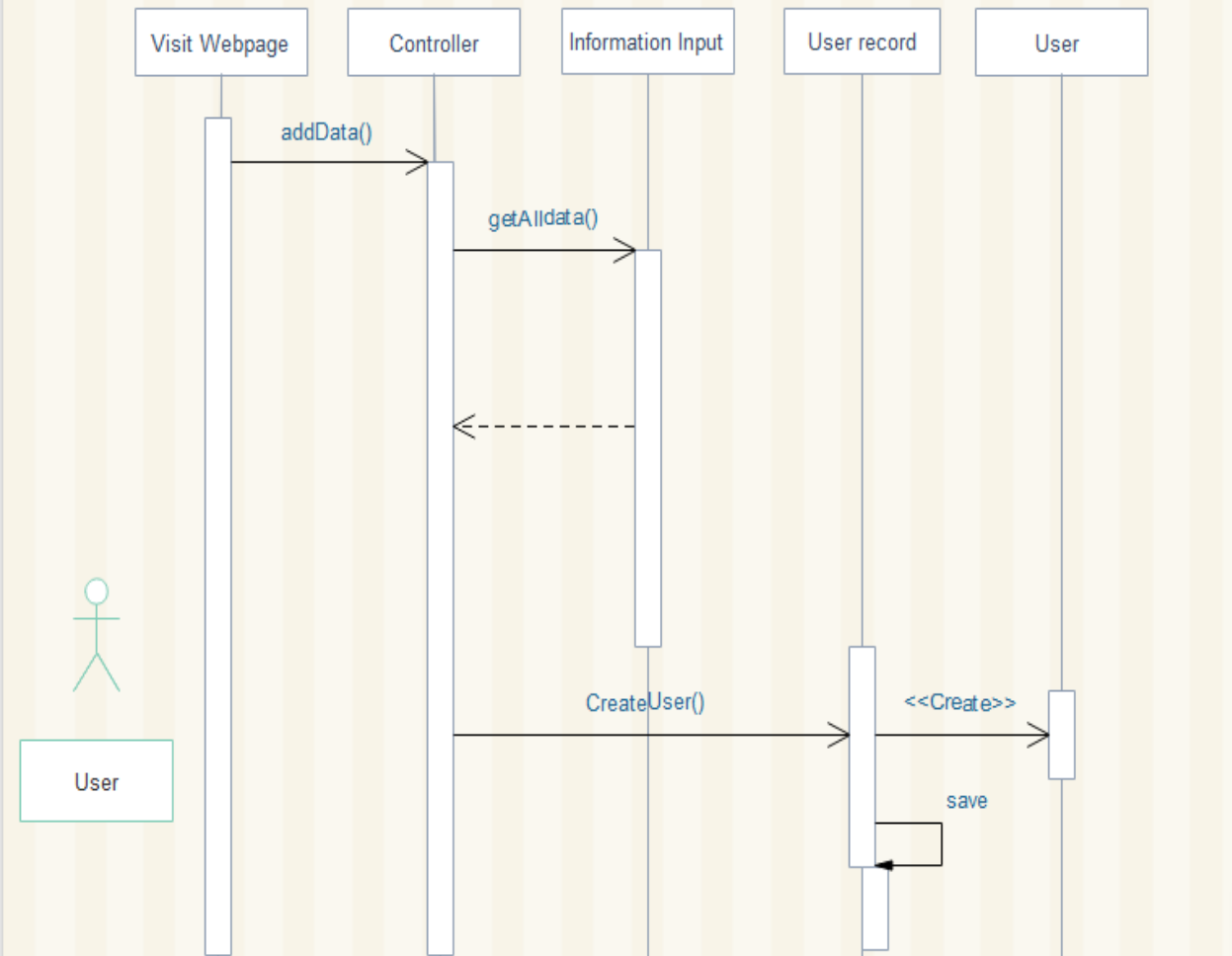


Figure 7: Sequence Diagram for User

Chapter 5

Database Design

Database design is the process of producing a detailed data model of database. This data model contains all the needed logical and physical design choices and physical storage parameters needed to generate a design in a data definition language, which can then be used to create a database. A fully attributed data model contains detailed attributes for each entity.

It is a collection of information that is organized so that it can be easily accessed, managed and updated.

Data is organized into rows, columns and tables, and it is indexed to make it easier to find relevant information. Data gets updated, expanded and deleted as new information is added. Databases process workloads to create and update themselves, querying the data they contain and running applications against it.

Computer databases typically contain aggregations of data records or files, such as sales transactions, product catalogs and inventories, and customer profiles.

Typically, a database manager provides users with the ability to control read/write access, specify report generation and analyze usage. Some databases offer ACID (atomicity, consistency, isolation and durability) compliance to guarantee that data is consistent and that transactions are complete.

Databases are prevalent in large mainframe systems, but are also present in smaller distributed workstations and midrange systems, such as IBM's AS/400 and personal computers.

5.1.1 Structure of the Database System

The database structure of a database system is its structure described in a formal language supported by the database management system (DBMS). The term "schema" refers to the organization of data as a blueprint of how the database is constructed (divided into database tables in the case of relational databases). The formal definition of a database schema is a set of formulas (sentences) called integrity constraints imposed on a database. These integrity constraints ensure compatibility between parts of the schema. All constraints are expressible in the same language. A database can be considered a structure in realization of the database language. The states of a created conceptual schema are transformed into an explicit mapping, the database schema. This describes how real-world entities are modeled in the database.

5.1.2 Requirements of Data

Data requirements are prescribed directives or consensual agreements that define the content and/or structure that constitute high quality data instances and values. Data requirements can thereby be stated by several different individuals or groups of individuals.

It is required to maintain system data or files. It provides a brief description of the required data and files that the system must need to run it's functions. It can be separated into two categories: static and dynamic. The first step in gathering system data is to determine what data is required for building the model. This should be dictated primarily by the scope and level of detail required to achieve the model objectives as described earlier. It is best to go from general to specific in gathering system data. The initial focus should be on defining the overall process flow to provide a skeletal framework for attaching more detailed information. Detailed information can then be added gradually as it becomes available (e.g., resource requirements, processing times, etc.). Starting with the overall process flow not only provides an orderly approach to data gathering, but also enables the model building process to get started which reduces the amount of time to build and debug the model later. Often, missing data becomes more apparent as the model is being built.

In defining the basic flow of entities through the system, a flow diagram can be useful as a way of documenting and visualizing the physical flow of entities from location to location. Once a flow diagram is made, a structured walk-through can be conducted with those familiar with the operation to ensure that the flow is correct and that nothing has been overlooked. The next step might be to define the detail of how entities move between locations and what resources are used for performing operations at each location. At this point it is appropriate to identify location capacities, move times, processing times, etc.

5.2 Entity Relationship Diagram

Entity Relationship Diagram shortly known as ERD shows the relationships among entities. ERD graphically illustrates an information system's entities and the relationships between those entities. An ERD is a conceptual and representational model of data used to represent the entity framework infrastructure.

The elements of an ERD are:

- Entities
- Relationships
- Attributes

5.2.1 Entities

An entity is any singular, identifiable and separate object. It refers to individuals, organizations, and systems, bits of data or even distinct system components that are considered significant in and of them.

The term is used in a number of programming languages/concepts, database management, systems design and other arenas.

There are 3 types of entities:

- **Strong Entities** are the entities which can be fully identified by its own attributes and it is independent from other entity types.
- **Weak Entities** are the entity which can't be fully identified by its own attributes and takes the foreign key as an attribute (generally it takes the primary key of the entity it is related to) in conjunction.
- **Associative Entities** are used in relational and entity–relationship theory. A relational database requires the implementation of a base relation (or base table) to resolve many-to-many relationships. This kind of base relation is called an associative table.

5.2.2 Relationships

A relationship, in the context of databases, is a situation that exists between two relational database tables when one table has a foreign key that references the primary key of the other table. Relationships allow relational databases to split and store data in different tables, while linking disparate data items.

There are three types of relationships:

- **One-to-one:** Both tables can have only one record on either side of the relationship. Each primary key value relates to only one (or no) record in the related table. They're like spouses—you may or may not be married, but if you are, both you and your spouse have only one spouse. Most one-to-one relationships are forced by business rules and don't flow naturally from the data. In the absence of such a rule, you can usually combine both tables into one table without breaking any normalization rules.
- **One-to-many:** The primary key table contains only one record that relates to none, one, or many records in the related table. This relationship is similar to the one between you and a parent. You have only one mother, but your mother may have several children.

- **Many-to-many:** Each record in both tables can relate to any number of records (or no records) in the other table. For instance, if you have several siblings, so do your siblings (have many siblings). Many-to-many relationships require a third table, known as an associate or linking table, because relational systems can't directly accommodate the relationship.

5.2.3 Attributes

A database attribute is simply a column name in a table in a database.

A database is comprised of tables. Each table has columns and rows; the columns in a database are called database attributes.

This makes sense when you think of it, given that the non-technical definition of an attribute is that it defines a characteristic or quality of something.

In computing, an attribute is a specification that defines a property of an object, element, or file. It may also refer to or set the specific value for a given instance of such. For clarity, attributes should more correctly be considered metadata. An attribute is frequently and generally a property of a property. However, in actual usage, the term attribute can and is often treated as equivalent to a property depending on the technology being discussed. An attribute of an object usually consists of a name and a value; of an element, a type or class name; of a file, a name and extension.

Single valued Attributes: An attribute, that has a single value for a particular entity is known as single valued attributes. For example, age of an employee entity.

Multi valued Attributes: An attributes that may have multiple values for the same entity is known as multi valued attributes. For example colors of a car entity.

Compound Attribute/Composite Attribute: Attribute can be subdivided into two or more other Attribute. For Example, Name can be divided into First name, Middle name and Last name.

Simple Attributes/Atomic Attributes: The attributes which cannot be divided into smaller subparts are called simple or atomic attributes. For example, age of employee entity

Stored Attribute: An attribute, which cannot be derived from other attribute, is known as stored attribute. For example: BirthDate of employee.

Derived Attribute: Attributes derived from other stored attribute. For example age from Date of Birth and Today's date.

5.3 Entity Relationship Diagram (ERD)

An *entity relationship model*, also called an *entity-relationship (ER) diagram*, is a graphical representation of entities and their relationships to each other, typically used in computing in regard to the organization of [data](#) within [databases](#) or information systems. An entity is a piece of data-an [object](#) or concept about which data is stored.

Relationships Between Entities

A relationship is how the data is shared between entities. There are three types of relationships between entities:

1. One-to-One

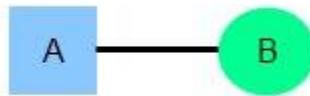


Figure 8: One-to-One relationship

One instance of an entity (A) is associated with one other instance of another entity (B). For example, figure 8 shows in a database of employees, each employee name (A) is associated with only one social security number (B).

2. One-to-Many

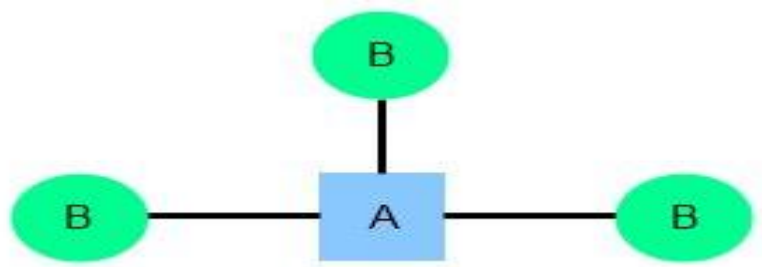


Figure 9: One-to-Many relationship

One instance of an entity (A) is associated with zero, one or many instances of another entity (B), but for one instance of entity B there is only one instance of entity A. For example, figure 9 shows for a company with all employees working in one building, the building name (A) is associated with many different employees (B), but those employees all share the same singular association with entity A.

3. Many-to-Many

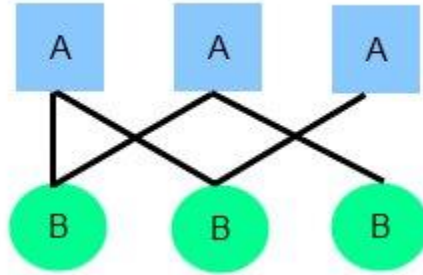


Figure 10: Many-to-Many relationship

One instance of an entity (A) is associated with one, zero or many instances of another entity (B), and one instance of entity B is associated with one, zero or many instances of entity A. For example, figure 10 shows for a company in which all of its employees work on multiple projects, each instance of an employee (A) is associated with many instances of a project (B), and at the same time, each instance of a project (B) has multiple employees (A) associated with it.

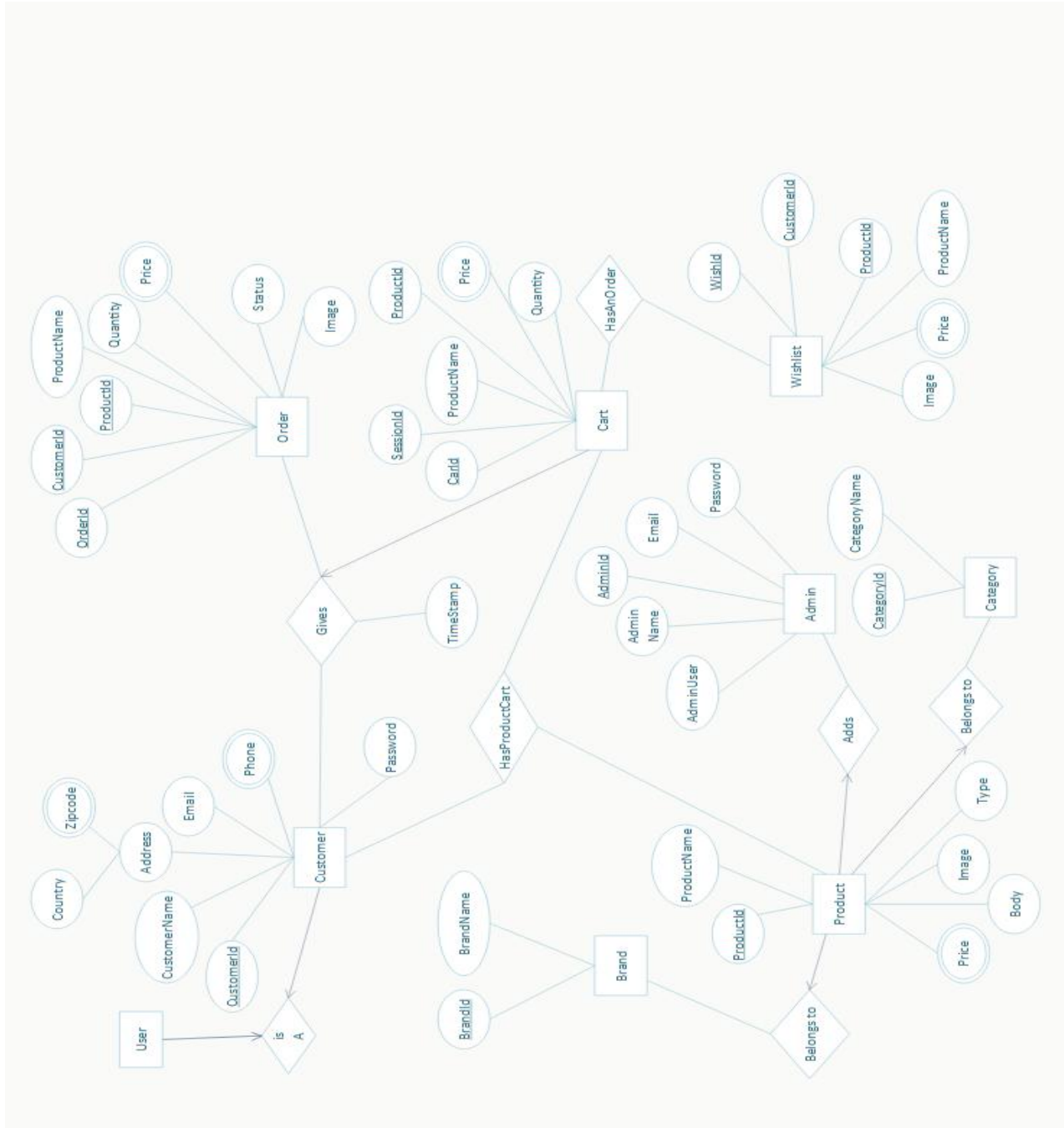


Figure 12 shows the Entity Relationship Diagram of Online Marketplace

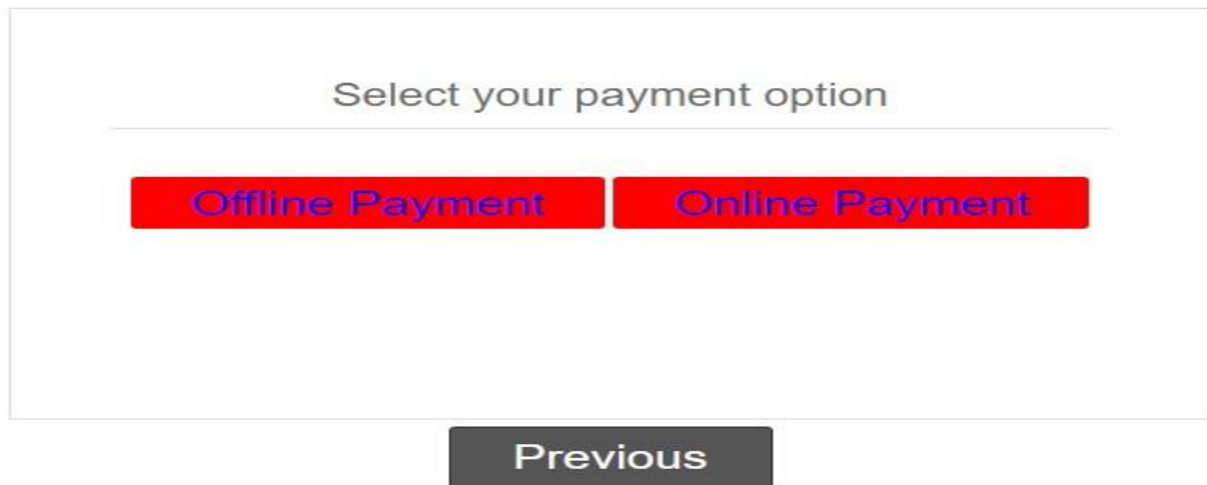


Figure 23: Payment method

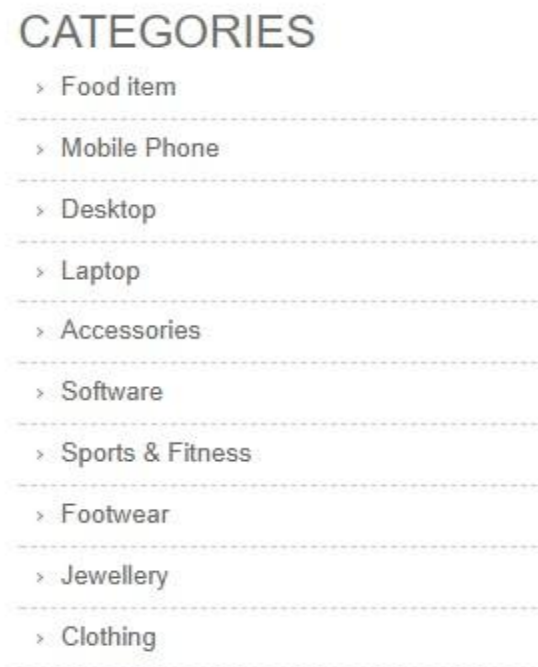


Figure 24: Category List

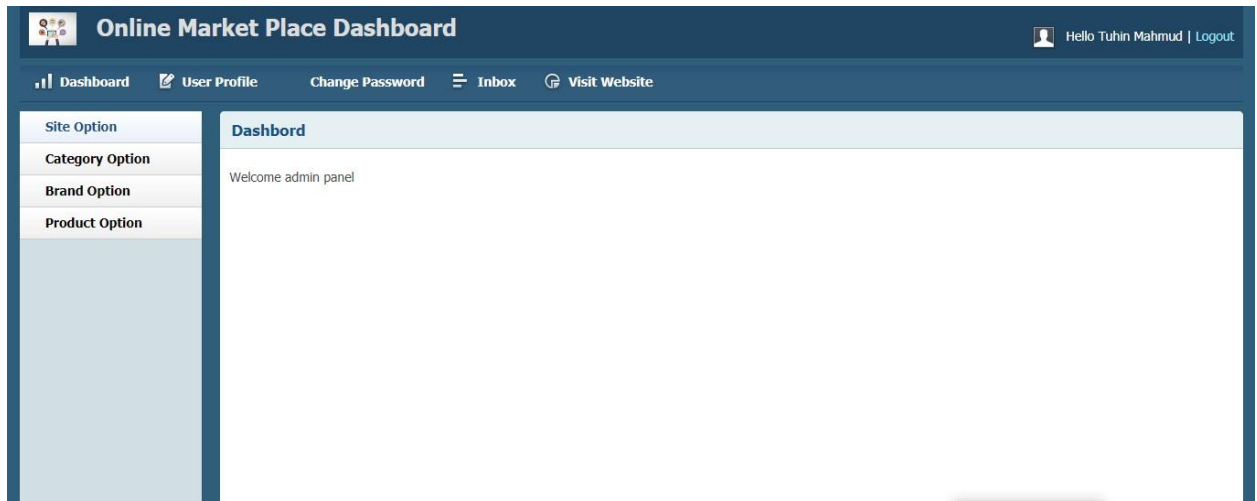


Figure 25: Dashboard

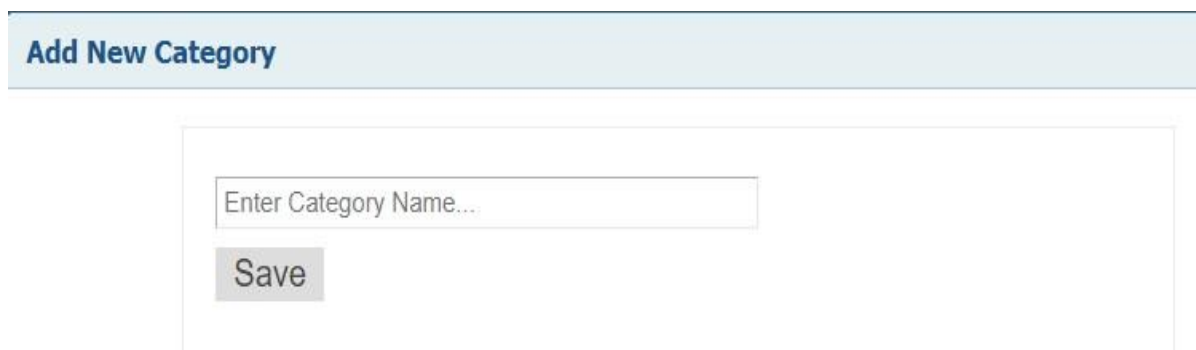

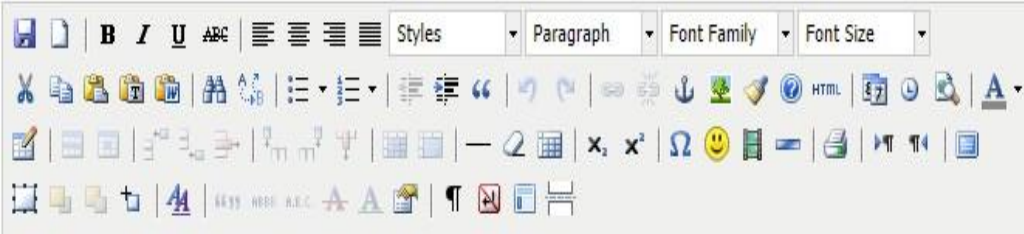

Security of the System

System Security is responsible for controlling access to system resources, which will include sensitive data. System security is concerned with all aspects of these arrangements. The purpose of security of the system is to prevent unauthorized access to the system as well as to store the data in such a way that it doesn't get lost. That is why, in this project we have added the different functionalities for both the Admin and the Users. The general Users can only view the data and shop that. But only the Admin has the privileges to modify the data which includes inserting, updating and deleting the data whenever it is necessary.

7.1 Security for User:

In this system, the Users have a unique id and password. So no unauthorized persons get the permission to access any other's account. And so it is secured with a id and password and so the personal information of the users are secured and nobody can access that until knowing the id and password.

7.2 Security for Admin

In this system, the Admin have also a unique id and password and it is fully secured. So unauthorized persons don't have the access to the Admin area and without entering into the Admin area, nobody can change or edit and delete the system information.

7.3 Secured with Session Cookie:

WebPages have no memories. A user going from page to page will be treated by the website as a completely new visitor. Session cookies enable the website you are visiting to keep track of your movement from page to page so you don't get asked for the same information you've already given to the site. Cookies allow you to proceed through many pages of a site quickly and easily

without having to authenticate or reprocess each new area you visit.

Session cookies allow users to be recognized within a website so any page changes or item or data selection we do is remembered from page to page. The most common example of this functionality is the shopping cart feature of any e-commerce site. When we visit one page of a catalog and select some items, the session cookie remembers our selection so our shopping cart will have the items selected when we are ready to check out. Without session cookies, if we click CHECKOUT, the new page does not recognize our past activities on prior pages and our shopping cart will always be empty.

We can adjust your session cookies through the settings feature of your browser.

Without cookies, websites and their servers have no memory. A cookie, like a key, enables swift passage from one place to the next. Without a cookie every time we open a new web page the server where that page is stored will treat us like a completely new visitor.

Websites typically use session cookies to ensure that we are recognized when we move from page to page within one site and that any information we have entered is remembered. For example, if an e-commerce site did not use session cookies then items placed in a shopping basket would disappear by the time we reach the checkout. We can choose to accept session cookies by changing the settings in your browser.

7.4 Security of Database

Database security refers to the collective measures used to protect and secure a database or database management software from illegitimate use and malicious threats and attacks.

It is a broad term that includes a multitude of processes, tools and methodologies that ensure security within a database environment. Database security covers and enforces security on all aspects and components of databases. This includes:

- Data stored in database
- Database server
- Database management system (DBMS)
- Other database workflow applications

Database security is generally planned, implemented and maintained by a database administrator and or other information security professional.

Some of the ways database security is analyzed and implemented include:

- Restricting unauthorized access and use by implementing strong and multifactor access and data management controls.
- Load/stress testing and capacity testing of a database to ensure it does not crash in a distributed denial of service (DDoS) attack or user overload.
- Physical security of the database server and backup equipment from theft and natural disasters.
- Reviewing existing system for any known or unknown vulnerabilities and defining and implementing a road map/plan to mitigate them.

Testing

Software testing is an activity to check whether the actual results match the expected results and to ensure that the software system is defect free. It involves execution of a software component or system component to evaluate one or more properties of interest.

Software testing also helps to identify errors, gaps or missing requirements in contrary to the actual requirements. It can be either done manually or using automated tools. Some prefer saying Software testing as a white box and black box testing.

It is an investigation conducted to provide stakeholders with information about the quality of the software product or service under test. Software testing can also provide an objective, independent view of the software to allow the business to appreciate and understand the risks of software implementation. Test techniques include the process of executing a program or application with the intent of finding software bugs (errors or other defects), and verifying that the software product is fit for use.

Software testing involves the execution of a software component or system component to evaluate one or more properties of interest.

8.1 Importance of Software Testing

Testing is important because software bugs could be expensive or even dangerous. Software bugs can potentially cause monetary and human loss, history is full of such examples.

- In April 2015, Bloomberg terminal in London crashed due to software glitch affected more than 300,000 traders on financial markets. It forced the government to postpone a 3bn pound debt sale.
- Nissan cars have to recall over 1 million cars from the market due to software failure in the airbag sensory detectors. There has been reported two accident due to this software failure.
- Starbucks was forced to close about 60 percent of stores in the U.S and Canada due to software failure in its POS system. At one point store served coffee for free as they unable to process the transaction.
- Some of the Amazon's third party retailers saw their product price is reduced to 1p due to a software glitch. They were left with heavy losses.

- Vulnerability in Window 10. This bug enables users to escape from security sandboxes through a flaw in the win32k system.
- In 2015 fighter plane F-35 fell victim to a software bug, making it unable to detect targets correctly.
- China Airlines Airbus A300 crashed due to a software bug on April 26, 1994, killing 264 innocent live
- In 1985, Canada's Therac-25 radiation therapy machine malfunctioned due to software bug and delivered lethal radiation doses to patients, leaving 3 people dead and critically injuring 3 others.
- In April of 1999, a software bug caused the failure of a \$1.2 billion military satellite launch, the costliest accident in history
- In may of 1996, a software bug caused the bank accounts of 823 customers of a major U.S. bank to be credited with 920 million US dollars.

8.2 Types of Software Testing

8. Software Products and related work products.

8.2.1 Process:

A software development process, also known as a software development lifecycle, is a structure imposed on the development of a software product. A software process is represented as a set of work phases that is applied to design and build a software product. Testing is a process rather than a single activity.

- In our system, we have followed a sequential process by which it has been possible to develop the system gradually.

8.2.2 All Life Cycle Activities:
